Independence Day brings fun, food and fireworks A few friendly reminders so we can all have a safe holiday:

Fireworks: Read directions and only use one at a time. Fireworks should never be handled by children. Monitor windy conditions and avoid using fireworks near homes, dry grass, animals, or flammable materials. Douse them in water before discarding them in an appropriate waste receptacle.

Water safety: If you are heading to a pool, lake, waterfall or river, wear lifejackets and never swim or boat alone.

Grilling safety: A lit grill should not be unattended. Keep a fire extinguisher readily available. Keep the grill at least 10 feet away from any structure or decorations.
