Letter from our President

HAPPY NEW YEAR Rambling Ridge Ramblers!

We are 64 paid members strong, up from 42 members in the previous year.

Your Board has been hard at work and I would like to recount some of what we have accomplished during 2022.

This list is not complete but some of the highlights:

We had two, well attended HOA membership meetings, one in the Spring, one in the Fall. Each had an excellent pot luck lunch. The first had a Firewise speaker and in the second we approved on the first vote a revised set of bylaws for the HOA Association. New Board members, Darrell Burnett, Vice President, Chris Frey, Treasurer, Paul Hooper, At-Large were elected.

Our Secretary created monthly newsletters that were emailed informing members of the latest RR news as well as adding to the website and a new resident directory.

Under Kenny Perry's able leadership, Firewise was organized and expanded. Because of his committee's efforts, 22 neighbors have agreed to Firewise assessments and over \$3,000 has been refunded to neighbors for their removal of combustibles from their property.

The "Care Bears" were created to assist any homeowner with any issue that they need addressed. Many have taken advantage of this "Neighbor Helping Neighbor" program. Our VP Darrell Burnett has been key in helping many with yard and right of way beautification along the roads. Letters have been written to homeowners who have not been maintaining their property as well as offering help to assist those in need.

A formal letter was sent to Aqua, NC about the number of water outages in RR over the past year. The HOA helped organize a large pipe repair as well as several smaller repairs this year.

The five set of Covenants and their amendments were synopsized making them more readable, therefore, more understandable. Also, each section's covenant synopsis contains all amendments relating to it.

Social events such as Dining Out, Dining In, Lunch Bunch and Men's night out were reinstituted after a covid break. An ice cream social was held in October for neighbors to get to know each other

I'm extremely pleased with what the Board has accomplished this last year and am truly excited about what the future will bring!

Neighbors Paul & Kim Hooper had a Firewise assessment recently. Some of the recommendations were very minor, such as adding a reflecting number address so emergency vehicles can locate quickly in an emergency.

The solar light helps also! Looks great!

Out of 22 assessments completed so far, 6 people who have already submitted the Firewise paperwork have received checks back for ½ of what they paid to have trees trimmed and removing forest fuel sources too close to house.

Dogs need a good run for their mental health, explore, sniff, and get some good energy out! Sadly, it should not be in a residential area where there are more hazards than benefits. Although it seems like we are out in nature, the reality we have is traffic from cars, delivery and work trucks and many other dangers. Even the best trained dogs who come back home when they are called are in danger of other things such as:

- running up or jumping on someone who is walking in our neighborhood. Some are elderly and might fall easily or some may rehabilitating after a surgery and need to be careful as well.
- eating something toxic. Dogs love to eat stinky things, even green things that might look innocent. Xylitol found in used chewing gum, compost pile with onions, tossed cigarettes, and many plants such as Lantana, Daffodil and Hydrangeas.
- snakes! One copperhead bite can be deadly and the smaller the dog, the faster you need to get to a vet since around 80% survive a bite if treated. Left untreated, they will likely not survive. If you didn't see them get bitten, it may be too late to help.
 - risk of chasing or being chased by a wild animal. Rabid animals or a defensive mama bear might attack an unleashed dog if cornered.
- Last but not least....it's is against our neighborhood covenants to let a dog roam free without it's owner & leash.

If you don't have a fenced yard, consider one of the many parks near us or enjoy walking in our neighborhood leashed up!
