NEW PROGRAM TO RECYCLE FOAM

Henderson County started a Foam Polystyrene Collection Pilot Program this year. Take out containers, cups, egg cartons, meat trays and packing materials made of foam cannot be recycled with your curbside recycling, so it usually ends up in the landfill. "Styrofoam" type materials account for 25-35% of landfill waste, are not biodegradable and take hundreds of years to break down.

Most around here eat a 70-80% plant based diet. They eat both Berries, fruits, acorns/nuts, honey, birds/eggs if they can get them, grasses and roots, insects, moles and voles and fish. *AND bird seed*. Keep your bird feeders up high and don't put the garbage bags or cans out the night before if you don't want a mess in the morning!
